Consent to Disclose (FERPA) Waiver

The University of Mississippi maintains compliance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA-20 U.S.C. Sections 1232G; and implementing regulations, 34 C.F.R. Section 99.1 etseq). As required by federal law, the University of Mississippi provides students with the right to prevent disclosures of education records to third parties within certain limited exceptions. This protection involves obtaining written consent of a student before releasing personally identifiable data about the student from records, unless release of records falls within expectations permitted in the provisions of FERPA and University policy, which allow disclosure without prior consent.
