Dear Alpha Tau Omega Fraternity:

On Feb. 1, 2022, you accepted responsibility for violating the following University Conduct Rule(s) and Regulation(s):

Violation of Other University Policies (Unregistered Event)

To increase your understanding of how your behavior impacted others and the community, you are agreeing to the following sanction:

- Our executive council will host an informative session on the event registration process and what the University considers grounds for an event to be registered. We believe this will help to put future events in perspective, as many members did not understand why events in our own house involved the University. By making them aware of the registration process, we hope to put the current issue and proposed solutions into perspective. Due March 1, 2022.
- Help facilitate an IFC Roundtable discussion or gather feedback from IFC leadership as issues/recommendations concerning the event registration process and/or conduct processes related to event management. A document is due to the Office of Conflict Resolution and Student Conduct by March 1, 2022.
- Install a new lock system and have it installed by August 1, 2022.
- Additionally, in order to prevent a spontaneous, unregistered social event, the chapter will be hiring a security guard or a member volunteer to be in place on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights between the hours of 8pm and 2am. Furthermore, at least two members of the chapter executive board will be required to be at the chapter house between the hours of 8pm and 2am on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and on any other night where a registered social event took

place.

You will be held accountable for completing all of the sanctions as described. Failure to comply with sanctions may result in additional charges from the Office of Conflict Resolution and Student Conduct.
