Dear Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity:

On February 5th, 2018, the University Judicial Council convened a hearing to consider the report brought against you for allegedly violating University Conduct Rules and Regulations.

Based on the preponderance of the evidence presented at the hearing and in the case file, the University Judicial Council made the following finding regarding the University Conduct Rules and Regulations for which you were charged:

Student Organizational Conduct -- Responsible

As such, you have been issued the following sanctions:

Your organization is prohibited from sponsoring or participating in any organized social activity, party, or function effective February 5, 2018 through May 14, 2018.

You will be held accountable for completing all of the sanctions as described. Failure to comply with sanctions may result in additional charges from the Office of Conflict Resolution and Student Conduct.

Under certain conditions, you have the right to appeal the decision in this case and/or the sanctions. Please note that an appeal must be submitted in writing to me within five business days from today's notice of the hearing outcome, by February 13, 2018.

Students who do not complete sanctions within the time frame required are subject to additional conduct charges such as a fine of \$150.00 from the Office of Conflict Resolution and Student Conduct.
